



All-New Science Lab Turns Concepts Into Concrete Learning Experiences

Science just got a lot more hands-on at Balboa this year, thanks to a partnership between the school and the Balboa Spirit Club!

Our brand-new Science Lab is staffed by Mrs. Susanna Chong, who has been a secondary math and science teacher for 12 years. Her teaching experience has included five years of teaching high school integrated math, and three years of teaching engineering courses for elementary students with the UCLA Science Project. In April, Mrs. Chong received the "Science and Technology Teacher Award" from the Chatsworth Chamber of Commerce for her work as an elementary science lab coordinator at Porter Ranch Community School. This summer, she worked with the UCLA Science and Math Project to coordinate and design the curriculum for the highly successful Balboa STEM Summer Program.

This year, Mrs. Chong plans to take the science curriculum taught by Balboa's teachers into the Science Lab, and turn it into hands-on experiments to cement those concepts in students' minds. Each grade level is on a different schedule to best serve the material and the children's needs.

The Balboa Spirit Club pays Mrs. Chong's salary with financial contributions from parents and the community. Help keep this amazing program going by

Babysitting will be available. If you are interested in childcare, please RSVP to Christina Yu at clokming@hotmail.com, so that we can provide your children food/snacks.


